

Material	What to recycle	How to prepare	Do not include
<b>GLASS</b> 	All bottles and jars, clear, brown and green, deposit and non-deposit.	Rinse clean. Remove metal and plastic lids and rings. Labels may be left on	Dishes, ceramics, mirrors, pyrex, light bulbs, crystal, broken glass, etc.
<b>PLASTIC</b> 	Plastic Containers & Jugs #1 - #7	Rinse clean. Remove metal and plastic caps and rings.	Plastic lids and bands. Films and flexible items other than rigid containers. Plastic Bags.
<b>METAL CANS &amp; ALUMINUM</b> 	Steel ("tin") and mixed metal cans and lids. Empty cans of latex (water based) paint. Deposit and non-deposit cans, and pure aluminum items.	Rinse clean.	Cans with plastic or paper parts, aerosol cans, scrap metal, propane tanks. Bottles and jar lids, pots and cookware, other items that contain non-metal or non-aluminum materials.
<b>NEWSPAPER</b> 	Newspaper, including Sunday supplements and newsprint mailers.	Loose	SEE MIXED PAPER.
<b>MIXED PAPER</b> 	Office paper, magazines, phone books, paper back books, cereal, cracker and other box-board boxes, junk mail including envelopes and windows.	Loose	Plastic films, tissue paper, plastic and wax paper liners from inside cereal boxes, etc.
<b>CARDBOARD</b> 	Corrugated boxes - clean	Flatten and remove excess tape.	Large appliance boxes not cut; metal strapping, excess tape.

- Trash and recyclables must be placed at curbside before 7:00 a.m. on your scheduled collection day. (Trash - 5 bag / barrel limit per week).

- Place all recyclables in the tote provided. Separate a few feet from trash.

- If the collectors leave items in the bin, it is because they are not recyclable in our curbside program. Find another outlet for recycling or put them in your regular trash.

- Replacement recycling totes can be purchased at the DPW.

### LEAVES • BRUSH • COMPOST AREA

Leaves will be picked up by Allied Waste during the period October 17th through December 2nd on your regular trash collection day.

**Leaves must be in biodegradable paper bags only; plastic bags will not be collected.** The leaf dump at Farnham Road will be open from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. on the Saturdays and Sundays shown on the calendar on the reverse side. Leaves in biodegradable paper bags shall be deposited by the residents on the compost windrow - leaves in plastic bags shall be emptied on to the windrow by residents. Limbs not to exceed 10" in diameter, and brush will be accepted. Special arrangements (for a fee) for larger limbs and stumps must be made by calling the Department of Public Works (784-1525). No fences, lumber or railroad ties.

### SPECIAL HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DAY

Household Hazardous waste will be collected at the DPW yard. A special mailing with detailed instructions will be sent to each residence prior to the event.

### TIRES • BATTERIES • WHITE GOODS • MISCELLANEOUS

Tires and batteries may be dropped off at the DPW yard, Monday thru Thursday (8:00 A.M. - 3:00 P.M.) and Friday (8:00 A.M. - 12:00 P.M.) for a small fee.

Tire off rim \$3.00 each. Tire on rim \$5.00. Battery \$1.00. White goods will be picked up at the curb, by the DPW after payment is made at the DPW offices. Refrigerator doors must be removed, by law. The fee varies per item.

Miscellaneous large items may be brought to the DPW and will be accepted for a fee according to posted fee schedule.

\*Effective April 1, 2000, television sets, computer monitors, video games and fluorescent lights are banned from our solid waste facilities. These items may be delivered to the DPW office, fee based according to posted fee schedule.
